FY 2022-23 Accomplishments





Fundraising/Grants:

Our numerous donors, sponsors and grantors partnered with us to allow OPAL to be a welcoming center of artistic inquiry, creative expression and art appreciation in Oak Park and the surrounding communities. Funds raised at our annual Starry Night fundraiser and from our annual year-end appeal, along with contributions from our gallery sponsors contributed to OPAL's success.

Grants received from the supporters of our Youth Art Education Outreach allowed those programs to thrive.
General operating support grants received from the Oak Park Area Arts Council and the Illinois Arts Council Agency allowed OPAL to maintain operations necessary to fulfill our mission.

OPAL continued making progress in the grant funding process with the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity toward the goal of installing an ADA accessible restroom on the first level, and additional renovations.

Exhibitions:

OPAL designed and published, for the first time, the entire year's Exhibition Calendar. This proved to be immensely beneficial for exhibiting artists to project and consider the different exhibition "Calls" offered and to plan their submissions ahead of time.

The breakdown of the year's 10 exhibitions included: six "Open Call" exhibitions, two "Member Only" exhibitions, and, two "Juried" exhibitions. We thank Byline Bank and Good Heart/Work Smart Foundation for their continued exhibition sponsorships.



FY 2022-23 Accomplishments continued



Studio Courses:

We improved and expanded our facilities to accommodate more course offerings for additional times and days. All of our facilitators and instructing artists are independent contractor professionals who schedule their availability with times and space OPAL provides.

We appreciate these individuals for their creative talents, and thank them for their time, hard work, and dedication to their craft as share their expertise with fellow artists at every level of learning.



Education, Events, and Activities:

We provided facility resources to the Oak Park Education Foundation's Spoken Word Club, middle school students, who met and practiced their craft, culminating in a formal presentation/performance in OPAL's Gallery. Momenta Dance Company held practices and presented their performance, in the Gallery as well. As an OPRF Chamber member, OPAL hosted periodic business and organization panels through the year.

We continued and expanded our outreach programs. The **FamilysARTS** program, free for youth and their chaperones, provides craft activities for them to be creative together for a couple of hours on various Sunday mornings throughout the year.

CritTalk, for adult artists and art appreciators, is a free drop-in session for discussion and learning about the current exhibition and the work presented. This has been held on various Saturdays during the year.

Both of these started as pilot efforts to gage interest in the community and have become popular programs.

FY 2022-23 Youth Art Education Outreach







As the mission of the Oak Park Art League is to be a welcoming center of artistic inquiry, creative expression and art appreciation in Oak Park and the surrounding region, we are pleased to be able to continue programming for all ages that lives up to this mission.

In 2022-23, through collaboration with St. Angela Elementary School and the Hephzibah Children's Association, OPAL began to realize its goal of engaging under resourced young people, through art, on a larger scale, other than what we were able to offer through in-house classes at OPAL. By offering art classes to children off-site, we were able to share art education with far more students that could have attended OPAL as well as assist these organizations and teachers with art programs giving these children the resources to develop and refine their creative voice.

With the generous support of the **Mammel Family Foundation**, OPAL received a grant to support an in-school art program for K through 8th grade students at St. Angela Elementary School, in Chicago's Austin neighborhood. This grant enabled OPAL to provide curriculum-based art classes to over 150 students, on a weekly basis during the school year.

Also, through a grant from the Oak Park-River Forest Community Foundation's YES Fund, OPAL collaborated with Hephzibah Children's Association and established a way for these young people to make connections with their peers and community, through art, to process their feelings, perform better in school with a balanced education, and to explore interests they may not know they had. In our pilot program, OPAL provided art activity and education for these young folks, in their home environment.

We thank and congratulate Na Suen, who was instrumental in pioneering with us to create this "proof-of-concept" pilot program, and the entire St. Angela team of teachers and administrators who worked hard to put together and support this art education program for all the students. We are also grateful to Phoebe Hurd, OPAL's art facilitator and program liaison with Hephzibah Children's Association, and all of Hephzibah's dedicated staff, for everything they do!

OPAL proudly presented the artwork many of these young people created, giving them a crucial sense of community belonging. At the end of the last school year, OPAL hosted approximately 20 youth, and their chaperones, to a pizza party at OPAL where everyone could see their work highlighted in a real Gallery!

Being able to provide this service to the community highlights OPAL as a place where everyone can feel comfortable and welcome and enjoy an array of program offerings with their friends and families.
